Garapa, or Brazilian Oak, is naturally honey-yellow with a slight ribbon like aspect. The timber has a fine, irregular and interlocked grain with a medium texture. Similar to other hardwoods, sun exposure may cause Garapa to turn gray if you don't apply UV inhibitor finish to the deck boards.
